GPA

Music students have been shown to hold higher GPAs than students who do not participate in music in the same school. Kids who play a musical instrument are 52% more likely to go to college.



TEST SCORES

High-poverty students engaged in the arts achieve higher test scores in science and writing than their peers.



ATTENDANCE

Arts-engaged children are **3X** more likely to have excellent attendance records. In fact, at-risk students cite their **participation** in the arts as a reason for **staying in school**.



COLLEGE ENROLLMENT

A student involved in the arts is 4X more likely to be recognized for academic achievement and 3X more likely to earn a bachelor's degree.
